He has three times won the pacific league of the World Cup in Australia, including 2002 and 2003 seasons.</li> <li>◆ He has won 28 World Cup Grand Prix events with 9 different horses. Chris has been a member of the NSWIS elite squad since its inception.</li> <li>◆ Chris has been leading rider at Sydney Royal Show 6 times.</li> <li>◆ He has won and placed in the World Cup and Grand Prix events in Europe and was a member of the first Australian team to win a Nations Cup event in Western Europe.</li> <li>◆ Chris has been a coach for nearly 20 years and has taught young riders from junior ranks to competing with success internationally.</li> <li>◆ On the stud farm he runs, Chris breeds, breaks in and trains ShowJumpers. His top grand prix horse, Diamond B Ego, winner of the Golden Grand trophy for the past two seasons, awarded to the top points winner of the World Cup season, was bred, broken and trained at diamond b stud.</li> </ul>

When I was a teenager I was riding around the track in Centennial Park Sydney, the horse I was on spooked sideways and I was pulled off back wards, my foot got caught in the left iron.</p> <p>I can think of no more horrifying thought than watching a rider caught up, the potential for disaster makes your blood run cold. I know if I had toe stoppers I would not have been able to be hooked up, and a potential injury avoided.</p>
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
